King County has not taken any steps to respond to the questions and challenges to the reasonableness of the County's methodology for calculating the "rental fee" under Ordinance 18403 submitted by the utilities. It is not anticipated that the County will do so for a month or more.

Representatives of the Boards of Tanner, Ames Lake Water Association, Sallal Water Association, Union Hill Water Association, and Foothills Water Association have scheduled a June 30 meeting with King County Council member Sarah Perry to discuss repeal of Ordinance 18403. These utilities were "Intervenors" (along with 22 water districts) in the now dismissed litigation that challenged the authority of the County to adopt ordinance 18403. Paul Bay is Tanner's representative on that group and took the lead in arranging the June 30 meeting. The group will ask Sarah Perry to support repealing the Ordinance.
